 The grant awards are restricted to the following approved mitigation categories as set forth in 215.5586(2)(e), Florida Statutes: Roof deck attachment; Secondary roof water barrier Roof Covering Bracing gable ends Reinforcing roof to wall connections Opening Protection Exterior doors, including garage doors (on attached garages only) Roofing, re-roofing, and window replacement work is restricted to the cost attributable to upgrading job specifications to use impact and pressure-rated/approved materials and retrofit techniques.		Post-Inspection Eligibility Requirements
		Not every home inspected meets the require- ments for construction approval. To be approved for construction a project must meet the following requirements:
		The project must be cost effective.
		 Existing structural features or damage cannot prevent the completion of the construction projects.
		• A Wind Certified Engineer (WCE) must be willing to certify that the recommended mitigation projects will increase the home's wind resistance rating.
Benefits of Mitigating Homes in Florida		 This program is a voluntary program. If participation is accepted, the homeowner agrees to the completion of all the recommended mitigation measures.
